



Tent vs RV

Set-Up

- Most basic tents can be put together by one or two people in 10 minutes
- If you have a tiny trailer, you'll have to do things like unhitching and putting down jacks
- If you're in a motorhome, you really don't have to do much at all! Some may require slide-outs and awnings

Packing

- With an RV, oftentimes, all you have to do is get in and go!
- Packing for a tent camping trip is a little more involved, as you have to pack in every piece separately

Comfort

- RVs have tents beat when it comes to comfort
- There's only so much you can do to make yourself comfortable in a small tent when your sleeping options consists of the ground, air mattress or a hard cot
- There is no climate control in a tent
- Cooking is done on a separate grill or on the open fire
- Bathrooms are communal ones or simply behind a tree
- In saying this, it is a great way to get connected to the great outdoors and experience nature up close and personal
- If you are looking for a more glamping experience, RV is the way to go!

Cost

- Tent camping is usually the cheaper option
- Good tents can be as cheap as \$40 and primitive campsites without hook-ups are usually cheaper than spots for RVs
- However, renting an RV can still be budget friendly!

Security

- If security is a big factor for you, RVs are decidedly much safer than a tent
- Most RVs have locking capabilities
- On the other hand, a tent is secured with a simple zipper

- If thoughts of intruders, creepy crawlers, or curious racoons keep you up at night, an RV might be the better option
- Even if you feel safe at a campground, RVs are nice because you can keep your camp gear safely stored away if you need to leave for some reason
